An example of this is clearly shown in Alvin York. He was drafted into the first world war in 1917 after the Germans started attacking the US ships in the Atlantic ocean. Alvin didn't want to go to war at first because he didn't want to kill people. But his captain allowed him a few days off to think, York came back determined to stop the war in any way he could. Then after a close friend died while the troops moved closer to Germany, York decided he needed to stop the war quickly. Then in October 8th York led maybe over 100 German prisoners into the American camp instead of killing them. When York met with his commanding officer he was promoted to the rank of sergeant. Then in 1919 he was recognized by President Wilson.

As you have seen above, that is one of the rewards you can receive when you serve. It really makes you feel good about what you're doing. But now, because of COVID, we have been forced to stay home and some people even lost their jobs. I so far haven't been able to help much, but many people I know have. Kids my age serving at food pantry giving out of work families the food they need to survive so that they can use their other resources for more essential things. While most of us are serving there is still much chaos around. Some of the most known are protests, near crash of the stock market, and the closing of many businesses.

In my experience so far, service is a very good root to peace. I hope everybody will help to do this.


There are over 118 million
