


LIONS EYE FOUNDATION 4-C2 2020 REVIEW

In 2020, despite having to cope with Covid-19, the Lions Eye Foundation (LEF) Eye Clinic continued its dedicated mission of restoring and preserving the gift of sight. Even though from mid-March to June 13th the clinic operated with a limited staff and only handled emergency cases, a significant number of surgeries, eye injections, laser treatments, and ophthalmic diagnostic services occurred. The following summary illustrates how well the Eye Clinic performed while coping with Covid-19.

Surgeries	New Patients	Eye Injections	Laser Procedures	Ophthalmic Services	Minor Surgeries
198	244	653	211	2,461	12

The total medical cost for the 2020 eye care services was \$5,470,234.

A significant number of 4-C2 patients benefited from LEF eye care. A total of 68 patients from 4-C2 received eye surgeries and 117 new patients were referred during 2020. Of the nine member LEF districts, 4-C2 had the most patient surgeries, 34%, and new patient referrals, 48%. The following pie charts illustrate the considerable benefits received by 4-C2 Lions patients.



The 2020 results are a result of the dedicated efforts of the doctors and staff at the Eye Clinic, and Lions who support the Foundation.
